He's in the shop. (= He isn't in the street.) He's at the shops. (= He's shopping.)

She **is doing** her homework **now**. He **is reading** a book **at the moment**. The present simple is used for a regular action. It is often used with phrases like *every day, every morning, usually* or *all the time*.

I clean my teeth every morning. We go to school every day.

She has a shower every day. She is having a shower at the moment.
