To make short answers, we do not repeat *have to* or the main verb. We use only *do / does* in the affirmative and *don't / doesn't* in the negative.

Do you have to travel a lot?

Yes, I do.

Does she have to work outdoors?

Yes, she does.

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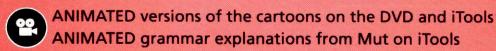
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
